ZION, GLORIOUS CITY



GEOGRAPHY OF ZION

Zion is the mountain where the Jebusites built Jerusalem, also known as Jebus, Salem or Zion (Josh. 18:28; 1Ch. 11:4-5; Gen. 14:18; Ps. 76:2; 2Sa. 5:6 -7).


This small fortress was taken by David, who made it the capital of his kingdom: "the city of David" (2 Sam. 5:7).


By bringing the ark to Jerusalem, David made Zion the dwelling place of God (Ps. 135:21).

About 600 meters north of Mount Zion was Mount Moriah, where Abraham had gone to sacrifice Isaac, who was replaced by a ram (Gen. 22:1-13).

In that place, David offered a sacrifice to stop the destruction caused by his sin (2 Sam. 24).

When Solomon built the Temple there, this mountain was annexed to Jerusalem, and was included as an integral part of Zion.
