


The two witnesses

Revelation 11



"And I will appoint my two witnesses, and they will prophesy for 1,260 days, clothed in sackcloth." They are "the two olive trees" and the two lampstands, and "they stand before the Lord of the earth" (Revelation 11:3-4)





"He asked me, "What do you see?"
I answered, "I see a solid gold lampstand with a bowl at the top and seven lamps on it, with seven channels to the lamps.
Also there are two olive trees by it, one on the right of the bowl and the other on its left" (Zechariah 4:2-3)

"I asked the angel who talked with me, "What are these, my lord?" He answered, "Do you not know what these are?" "No, my lord," I replied.

So he said to me, "This is the word of the Lord to Zerubbabel: 'Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,' says the Lord Almighty" (Zechariah 4:6)

Comparing Zechariah 4:6, these two witnesses are the Old Testament and the New Testament; the Word of God that testifies through harsh persecutions for 42 months, that is, 1,260 years, between 538 and 1798.

- atheist government.

- France "crucified" Christ by rejecting him and killing his disciples.

On November 26, 1793, in the midst of the "government of terror," a decree was promulgated in Paris to abolish religion.


On June 17, 1797, the French government removed the restrictions placed on the practice of religion.

From the "resurrection" of the two witnesses, the Bible was placed by God in a place where it could no longer be attacked by man.

Interest in the study of the Bible was an "earthquake" that shocked the world.

In 1804, the British and Foreign Bible Society was born in London, dedicated entirely to disseminating the Bible and encouraging its translation into all known languages.

In 2009, Bible Societies provided 561 million Scriptures to men, women and children around the world. That includes more than 20 million Bibles, 18.5 million New Testaments, 33 million individual books of the Bible, and nearly 490 million short Bible passages.
